Uniting the analytic tools of the humanities with those of the social science and joined by a team of clinical and military collaborators, the project seeks to deepen understandings of the meaning and significance of post-deployment life. The study will conduct focus groups with soldiers at multiple sites throughout the southeast to explore the moral challenges of service members.

Given the documented role of adolescent emotional reactivity as an intermediary mechanism in the link between family discord and adolescent developmental outcomes, this grant utilizes an interdisciplinary collaborative network (i.e., social sciences, electrical engineering, computer science, physiology, cardiology) to develop new tools necessary to examine dynamical transactions among psychophysiological facets of emotional reactivity. Communication processes at the triadic (two parents plus one adolescent) level are coded and analyzed to better understand how research can advance an understanding of emotional expression in family conflicts.

A phase III randomized controlled trial design intervention with a time-equivalent comparison condition examines the efficacy of an HIV intervention for adolescent/ young adult African-American females who consume alcohol to reduce unprotected sexual intercourse and enhance mediators of safer sex. Linear and logistic generalized estimating

equations (GEE) analysis examine the efficacy of the alcohol-adapted HIV intervention in reducing a biological marker of risky sex (Yc PCR assay) and enhancing HIV-preventive behaviors (e.g., consistent condom use) and objectively measured mediators (i.e., video coded role plays of assertive communication, refusal of sex under the influence of alcohol, and negotiation of condom use when drinking alcohol or when the male sex partner has been drinking alcohol) and self-reported psychosocial mediators (i.e., condom use self-efficacy, perceived peer norms supporting safer sex, condom application skills) of HIV-preventive behaviors over the 12-month follow-up.
